

WORD

FIRST READING Daniel 7:1-3, 15-18

L: A reading from Daniel.

In the first year of King Belshazzar of Babylon, Daniel had a dream and visions of his head as he lay in bed. Then he wrote down the dream: I, Daniel, saw in my vision by night the four winds of heaven stirring up the great sea, and four great beasts came up out of the sea, different from one another.

As for me, Daniel, my spirit was troubled within me, and the visions of my head terrified me. I approached one of the attendants to ask him the truth concerning all this. So he said that he would disclose to me the interpretation of the matter: "As for these four great beasts, four kings shall arise out of the earth. But the holy ones of the Most High shall receive the kingdom and possess the kingdom forever—forever and ever."

L: The word of the Lord.

C: Thanks be to God.

PSALM Psalm 149

L: We pray the Psalm responsively.

Hallelujah! Sing to the Lord a new song, God's praise in the assembly of the faithful.

Let Israel rejoice in their maker; let the children of Zion be joyful in their ruler. Let them praise their maker's name with dancing; let them sing praise with tambourine and harp.

For the Lord takes pleasure in the people and adorns the poor with victory.

Let the faithful rejoice in triumph; let them sing for joy on their beds.

Let the praises of God be in their throat and a two-edged sword in their hand,

to wreak vengeance on the nations and punishment on the peoples,

to bind their kings in chains and their nobles with links of iron,

to inflict on them the judgment decreed; this is glory for all God's faithful ones. Hallelujah!

SECOND READING Ephesians 1:11-23

L: A reading from Ephesians.

In Christ we have also obtained an inheritance, having been destined according to the purpose of him who accomplishes all things according to his counsel and will, so that we, who were the first to set our hope on Christ, might live for the praise of his glory. In him you also, when you had heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and had believed in him, were marked with the seal of the promised Holy Spirit; this is the pledge of our inheritance toward redemption as God's own people, to the praise of his glory.

I have heard of your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love toward all the saints, and for this reason I do not cease to give thanks for you as I remember you in my prayers, that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you a spirit of wisdom and revelation as you come to know him, so that, with the eyes of your heart enlightened, you may perceive what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance among the saints, and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power for us who believe, according to the working of his great power.



THE HOLY GOSPEL Luke 6:20-31

- "Blessed are you who are hungry now, for you will be filled.
- "Blessed are you who weep now, for you will laugh.

"Blessed are you when people hate you and when they exclude you, revile you, and defame you on account of the Son of Man. Rejoice on that day and leap for joy, for surely your reward is great in heaven, for that is how their ancestors treated the prophets.

"But woe to you who are rich, for you have received your consolation.

"Woe to you who are full now, for you will be hungry.

"Woe to you who are laughing now, for you will mourn and weep.

"Woe to you when all speak well of you, for that is how their ancestors treated the false prophets.

"But I say to you who are listening: Love your enemies; do good to those who hate you; bless those who curse you; pray for those who mistreat you. If anyone strikes you on the cheek, offer the other also, and from anyone who takes away your coat do not withhold even your shirt. Give to everyone who asks of you, and if anyone takes away what is yours, do not ask for it back again. Do to others as you would have them do to you."

THE SACRAMENT OF HOLY BAPTISM

Quinn Gordon Mukai Son of Marina and Jonathan Mukai Sponsors: Tim and Patty Young

P: In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

P: Holy Baptism is God's gift to his Church. In this sacrament we are initiated into the Christian life. We receive our identity as members of the family of God; and as Christ is our brother, we also become brothers and sisters to one another. We begin our new life, we live our new life, and we look forward to the resurrection under the sign of our Baptism. Today, God calls Quinn by name to enter into this inheritance.

To the Parents:

P: Marina and Jonathan, today you have brought your child, Quinn, for baptism: Do you confess with us your faith in Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord? Answer: We do.

P: We acknowledge your request on behalf of your child.

P: I charge you to remember your request and your affirmation to take seriously your responsibilities as parents. Today, Quinn is being incorporated into the body of Christ. You are thus called to rear him in the Christian faith and in fellowship with the Church so that as he grows into adult life, he may live in the vocation of his baptism. I, therefore, lay upon you the responsibility to teach him the Ten Commandments, the Apostles' Creed, the Lord's Prayer, to place in his hands the Holy Scriptures when he can read, to bring him regularly to the services of God's faithful people, and to provide for him instruction in the Christian faith. Do you promise before God and this gathering of believers to do this for Quinn? Answer: We do, with God's help.

To the Sponsors:

P: Tim and Patty, as Quinn's sponsors, you have also taken upon yourself responsibility for this child. You are to include him in your prayers, and if anything should happen to his parents or if they otherwise neglect their responsibility, you are to see to it that he is reared within the fellowship of Christ's Church. Do you promise to do your part in nurturing Quinn in the Christian faith? Answer: We do, with God's help.

To the Congregation:

P: We are all witnesses to this baptism. Through Baptism, Quinn becomes a member of our family. It becomes part of our responsibility to see to it that he is sustained within the mutual consolation and fellowship of Christ's Church.

C: We rejoice in this and give thanks to God for the salvation made known in Jesus Christ.

Baptism

P: Quinn Mukai, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

P: May you evermore be clothed with the righteousness of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, for whose sake God has now made you his child and promises you the fullness of the new life. Peace be with you.

The Sign of the Cross

P: Receive the sign of the Holy Cross, as a sign that through your baptism you are participating in the death and resurrection of Christ. Through the cross you have been redeemed; in baptism you receive the fullness of this redemption; and henceforth you are called to take up your cross and follow after Christ.

Presentation of the Light

P: Jesus said, "Let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven."

Prayer and Blessing

P: Let us pray. Almighty God, you make light to shine out of darkness, you make new life to spring out of old, you make of all people one new race; we thank you for giving your Church the gracious gift of Baptism, and that you have seen fit to welcome Quinn into this gift of grace.

C: Whether we are young or old, we ask together that you will make our baptism real and new every day, so that we may live together in the joy and power of the Holy Spirit, and at last live forever in your presence, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

P: Almighty God send you his light and truth to keep you all the days of your life. The hand of God protect you; his presence accompany you. God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit, cause his grace to be mighty upon you. **C: Amen.**

P: We offer these and all our prayers to you, O God, trusting in your grace and unyielding love; through Jesus Christ, our Lord.



You are invited to greet one another with a sign of Christ's peace and may say, "Peace be with you," or similar words.




OFFERTORY PRAYER



Save us from the time of trial and deliver us from evil.


For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and forever. Amen.

Take a taper from the basket on the table and light it from the pillar candle and then place the lit taper in the sand-filled bowl. Please place the tapers from back to front avoiding reaching over the burning candles.


